

Park Lake Outing: May 13-15, 2011

Laurent's Sun Village Resort: This resort has two ramps, one concrete and one gravel, with several loading floats. These gently sloping ramps are in fairly shallow water, so people with larger boats usually go elsewhere. The resort charges a \$2 launch fee. Sun Village also has over 100 RV sites, a big swim beach, a store, rental boats, moorage, restrooms with showers, picnic shelters and tables, a large play field, and other facilities. 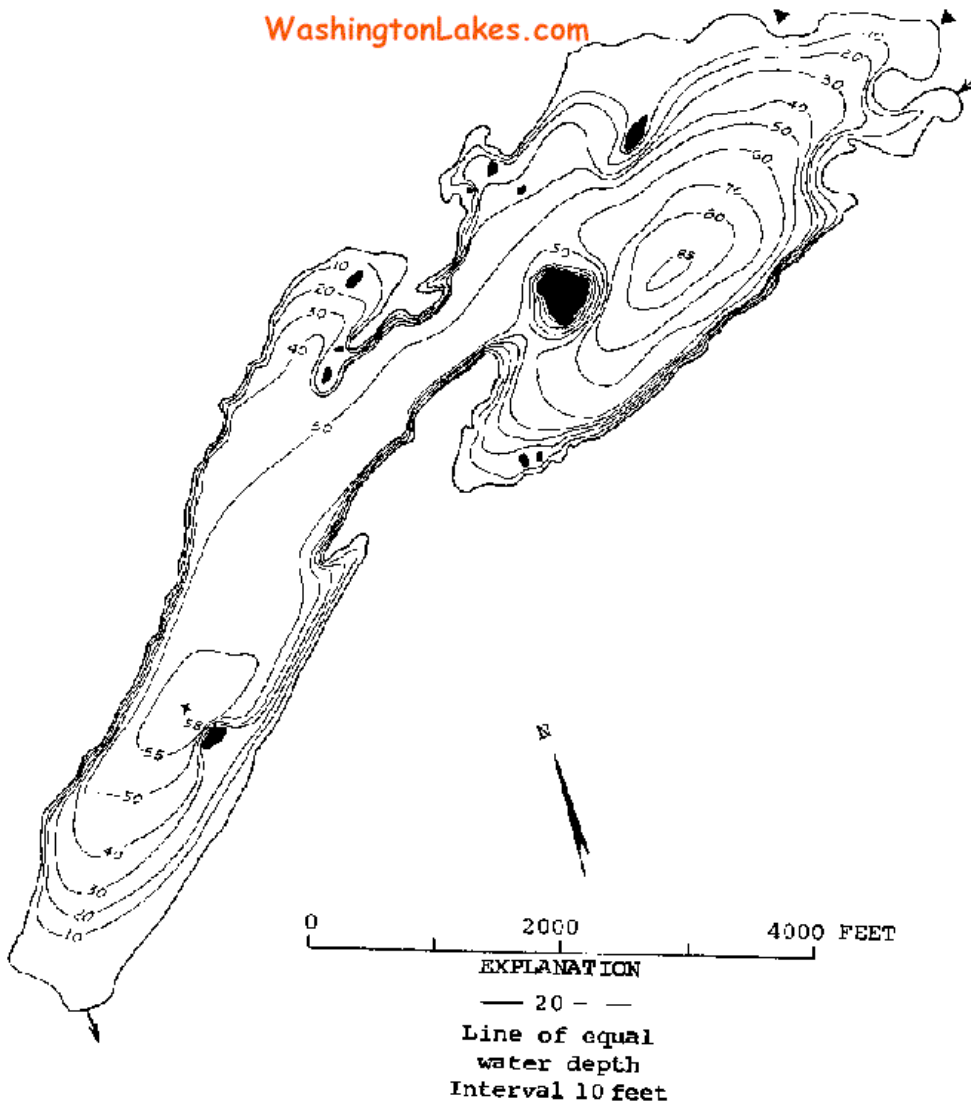
Department of Fish and Wildlife Ramp: This ramp, off Park Lake Road, is marked by a Public Fishing sign. It is a bit of a stretch calling this a boat ramp, since you can't really get a trailer into it, but it's good for pontoon boats and kayaks.



Park Lake has about 6 miles of shoreline and is 85 feet at its deepest point. The lake was formed in the same manner as the water sources in Sun Lakes State Park, by slow-moving glaciers passing through the area thousands of years ago. The state park has its own campground. Fishing is allowed year-round, though most anglers have better luck in the early fall, spring and summer. When the temperature drops, it may be harder to find fish, as they search out warmer water. The state park is open from 6:30 a.m. to dusk, as of February 2010.

Sun Lakes State Park is located at the North End of Park Lake at 34875 Park Lake Road NE, Coulee City, WA 99115. Sun Lakes-Dry Falls State Park is a 4,027-acre camping park with 73,640 feet of freshwater shoreline at the foot of Dry Falls. Dry Falls is one of the great geological wonders of North America. Carved by Ice Age floods that long ago disappeared, the former waterfall is now a stark cliff, 400 feet high and 3.5 miles wide. In its heyday, the waterfall was four times the size of Niagara Falls.

Today it overlooks a desert oasis filled with lakes and abundant wildlife.

Dry Falls Lake is open April 1 through Nov. 30.

Dry Falls Visitor Center winter hours: Oct. 1 - April 30, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. Fridays-Wednesdays (closed Thursdays and holidays).

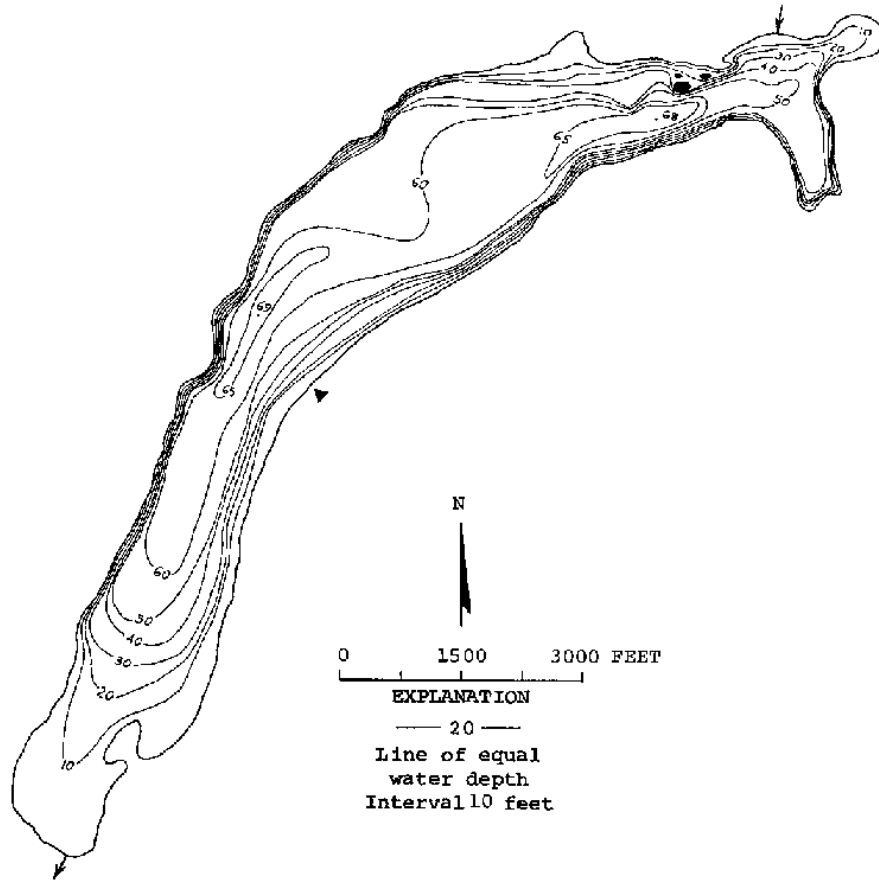


Blue Lake is adjacent and south of Park Lake

Like nearby Park Lake, Blue was treated with rotenone in the fall of 2006 to eliminate problem species and restocked with thousands of rainbow restore what had become a declining trout fishery. Also like Park, when its "healthy," Blue is a real trout factory, giving up limit catches of chunky rainbows and browns from the opening bell until early summer. When the hot-rod traffic starts it makes it tougher for fly fishing. The speed-boaters all go home after Labor Day, and trout fishing comes on strong again until the season closes at the end of September.

Fishing Park Lake and Blue Lake can be a problem; however, with the right flies your day can be more enjoyable. With profound Damselfly, Chironomid and Callibaetis hatches to name a few, these lakes are a fly-fishers paradise. With such an abundance of food available, small fry can easily gain up to 6-8 inches in a single year. Rainbows up to 22 inches and browns to 25 inches reside in these lakes, lurking in the depths, waiting to pound anything unfortunate enough to be in the water after the sun goes down, including your fly!

Driving Directions To Laurent's Sun Village Resort

Start in Tacoma

1. Merge onto I-5 N toward SEATTLE.
2. Merge onto WA-18 E via EXIT 142A toward AUBURN.
3. Merge onto I-90 E toward SPOKANE.
4. Merge onto WA-281-SPUR via EXIT 151 toward WA-283 N/EPHRATA/SOAP LAKE.
5. Take the WA-283 N ramp toward EPHRATA/SOAP LAKE.0.1 miles past S FRONTAGE RD W
6. Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto WA-283.
7. WA-283 becomes WA-28.

8. Turn LEFT onto WA-17. WA-17 is 0.2 miles past 2ND PL SE

9. Turn RIGHT onto PARK LAKE RD NE. If you reach ROAD D NE you've gone about 1.6 miles too far

10. 33575 PARK LAKE RD NE is on the RIGHT. If you reach the end of PARK LAKE RD NE you've gone about 2.6 miles too far
