Reality Check

My introduction to fly-fishing came in my late 40s, no spring chicken, but very able to bushwhack through terrain to reach a pristine creek or river or hike 3 miles with a float tube on my back to fish an alpine lake. My approach to fly-fishing and to life in general, has always been — keep moving, striving to stay upright and mobile. Well, things have changed as I've aged. My approach is now to ensure safety, comfort and continued success on the water.

In moving water I always use a wading staff which helps my stability and lessens my risk of falls. If I slip, that can be dangerous so I make sure to wear a wading belt to prevent water from filling my waders. Areas with strong

currents or slippery rocks are way out of my comfort level. Did I mention I don't swim! Ergo, my constant companion on the water is my life vest with a loud whistle attached. I remain a minimalist, even when fishing, so I make sure I haven't overloaded myself with too many fly boxes or equipment.

All my gear, including eyewear has been adapted to make things easier for me to fish. I also fish more from boats, float tubes and easily accessible shorelines; all this to reduce physical strain and to accommodate mobility issues. Meanwhile I (try) to maintain a fitness regime to support my fly-fishing adventures. These changes seem like a lot, but in my "mature years" I still appreciate the tranquility of being in nature and the beauty of fly-fishing. I intend to continue fly-fishing, prioritizing safety and comfort and focusing on the joy it brings me, rather than just on the catch.


NW Youth Conservation and Fly Fishing Academy
