Walking the Dog (Salmon)

Johns Creek

First outing: 12:30 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 9 Lunch at 11:30 a.m, Blondie's Restaurant, 628 W. Railroad Ave., Shelton

Second Outing: 1 p.m. Friday, Nov. 10 Lunch at Noon., Blondie's

Planning a club outing can be tricky, especially in estimating attendance. For our upcoming chum outing at Johns Creek, we're fortunate to have a signup sheet with over 14 members, twice our usual turnout. This is great news,

but we must also be mindful of overcrowding.

To address this, l've added a Thursday outing to split our group. l've contacted

most on the list to see who can switch, and I believe we have it

sorted. If you're not on the list but want to join, let me know, and I'll try to accommodate.

We'll meet for lunch, timing it with the incoming tide. I can help you find parking near the trailhead, just across from a Shell gas station on Highway 3. This peninsula, once a golf course, is now the Bayshore Preserve. If you're not with our group, follow the main loop trail past the outhouse until you see a signpost reading "Johns Creek Estuary," leading you to our fishing spot.

Traditional fly-fishing norms are

set aside. Bring an 8t o 10weight single-handed rod with a floating line or sink tip. Have chum fly patterns on sturdy h o o k s. I usually car-

ry chartreuse, pink, green, and purple, but this year, pale yellow

seems to be popular. If using a Type 3 or heavier sinking tip, bring large foam flies in bold colors. Attach a short section (2-3 feet) of 15- to 20-pound fluorocarbon for your leader. That's all you'll need. The Johns Creek estuary is in the Bayshore area of Mason County, off Highway 3 and Oakland Bay. It's about an hour from Tower Lanes in Tacoma via Highway 16, or a bit

longer via I-5 to Highway 101. If you're coming from Shelton, our lunch meet-up spot at Blondie's is only about 6 minutes away.

Thursday, November 9



Gabe is a district fisheries biologist who's district includes the Tacoma Narrows South including the Puyallup and Nisqually Drainages, all of the independent tributaries in the deep south sound and associated inlets as well as the East Kitsap.

His presentation will focus on inland lake management in South Puget Sound and will cover our inland lake trout program and stocking strategies for trout throughout the region. He will focus on Munn Lake and the unique angling opportunity Munn Lake provides for a Western Washington Lake.

He grew up on the Rocky Mountain Front in Montana fishing and hunting before heading to the University of Idaho for a B.S. in Fishery Resources. He then went to Central Michigan University where he completed his M.S. in fisheries.



3) Members Only will now available to you


