<u>FLY FISHERS INTERNATIONAL (FFI)</u> - I attended the Annual FFI meeting July 20th on a webinar/zoom program. The following is a short review of various remarks from Members of the Board, to get a complete review, please go to the FFI website and click on past webinars and the meeting will be available.

Tom Logan, Chairman of the Board - called the meeting to order. He reported this is the first and probably not the last meeting they'll conduct for future meetings. He was very pleased about the turnout at around 70+ participants.

Patrick Berry - President and CEO - remarked that the meeting is being recorded for future review. More remarks later.

Tilda Evans - Secretary of the Board - The Board will be reviewing voting procedures with the goal of recruiting new members, including more ladies, young folks, broader diversity, etc. Voting will be conducted next year.

Dave Peterson - Executive Committee Conservation Chair - FFI's theme "ALL FISH - ALL WATERS". Dave reviewed policies, publications, conservation grants, actions, scholarships, education, partnerships, etc.

Dutch Baughman - Executive Committee Education Chair - Dutch talked about the Learning Center. He suggested everyone go to the website to learn what is available. It is really remarkable as to what's available for download and what to view. There are many new manuals available to download. There are 14 new casting videos in the making and many more videos in the making, leadership, membership, etc.

Jim Maus - Treasurer, Finance Committee Chair - Jim reported the FFI's finances are very strong and a balanced budget. He stated that there will be a loss in 2020-2021, however; they are prepared for it. Please go to the webinar to learn more about Jim's report. Closing the meeting, Patrick spoke of a number of items. There will be no national event in 2020 or 2021. There will be future regional events throughout the country. TheLegislature created an "Office of Chehalis Basin" which is headquartered in Olympia. One of the subjects that is being studied, are levies in the flood zones. I have learned this subject has been going on for over 10 years I can write on forever on this matter, I recommend you go to the website -

Dear friends of Bristol Bay

With the release of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) on Pebble's proposal just few weeks away, we wanted to keep you in the loop on Trout Unlimited's Save Bristol Bay campaign and our efforts to stop the proposed Pebble mine so that you are plugged in and ready to help during this critical time:

- 1) Speak up or donate during this critical window. The release of the FEIS opens a critic a short window for the President (via the Army Corps of Engineers or the EPA) to stop this key permit from being issued. Once the Army Corps releases the FEIS, they plan to decide on whether to
- issue Pebble a permit 30-60 days later. Please stay tuned to Save Bristol Bay, take action and help encourage others in your networks to act, whether you're in Alaska or beyond.
- 2) We are grateful to have the shared goal of keeping Bristol Bay's fisheries healthy with a wide coalition of businesses, groups and individuals. We also recognize it's sometimes hard to know where to go for the latest information and that it sometimes causes confusion.

Please know that the <u>TU team in Anchorage</u> is always available to answer questions you might have, and we encourage you to follow TU's <u>"Save Bristol Bay" website</u>, emails and social media feeds closely over the coming weeks. If you are specifically looking to support our work in Bristol Bay, you can click on <u>"Donate" from the Save Bristol Bay website</u> and your gift will go directly to work on preventing Pebble's permit from being issued.
